
Holy Spirit Parish Vision Statement

Reflection on the Gospel of John 15:19-17



Reflecting on the passage of the Gospel of John 15:19-17, Jesus invites us to remain in his love like his father loves him and he loves us. To remain in his love implies to keep his commandment, one of his commandments is to love one another as he loves us.

One of our most desires and hope is to love like Jesus. As human beings our knowledge is limited, therefore we cannot understand the fullness God's love. Many times, our love to God and to others is mixed with our own desire, interest and condition. On the contrary, God's love is unconditional. He loves us for who we are, not for what we have or do. God does not love by appearances;

God loves the essence of being human. God's love is beyond our understanding and common sense. Therefore, Jesus invites us to remain in his love, to love one another as he loves us and that there is no greater love than to lay down his life for his friends. Indeed, Jesus calls us friends if we do what he commands us to do. He does not call us servants but friends because he reveals to us everything that he knows and learnt from his Father.

In the moment that Jesus calls us friends not anymore servants, we become a treasure to Him, Eccl 6:14 "Faithful friends are sturdy shelter: whoever finds one has found a treasure. Faithful friends are beyond price". Jesus calls us friends; such a great grace given to us to be his friends revealing to us what the father has revealed to him. Jesus' friendship and love go beyond expectation and self-interest. His love and friendship are so great that he gave his life for our Salvation. In the same manner, he invites us to give our life for our friends.

To give our life for our friends does not literally mean to die for our friends; but to go beyond our self-interest and to get out from our selfishness. To give life for our friends is to see the image of Jesus Christ in our neighbours. To accept them not by their appearance or for what they have, but for their essence of being humans - creation of God in his image and likeness. To give our life for our friends means to help and to accept them. To accompany them in difficult moments of their lives, to be compassionate and merciful especially to those who suffer because of discrimination, violence and abuse. Giving our life for our friends means to be generous with the poor and to visit the sick. To accompany and to welcome the migrants and the refugees who left everything they had in looking for better opportunity in their lives. To share our time and presence with those who feel alone and abandoned by their beloved ones.

God in his infinite and greater love will recompense all our deeds and good actions done to our brothers and sisters. Because Jesus himself gave his own life for our Salvation, his love is greater and unconditional. He chose us first to be his children and friends, He gives us the commission to go out; to preach the Good News and to bear fruit, fruit that will last.
